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Small Works: Reviving the Classics: Neoclassicism & Realism	Prior to modernism in the mid-nineteenth century, western art was dominated by the The Academy of Art. As a major academic movement, Neoclassicism revived the styles of the classical Greek and Roman world as seen in the work of Jacques Louis David, Jean Auguste Dominique Ingres and Benjamin West. This style is clearly visible today in the architecture of Washington D.C. and countless other government and institutional structures throughout the world. Simultaneously, many artists reacting against the Academy, began the long process of creating Modern art, with the first major Modernist movement being titled Realism. Artists and movements such as: Gustave Courbet, Edouard Manet, and The Ashcan School amongst others, chose to depict the contemporary everyday world instead of an idealized glorious past. This exhibition explores this tension between an idealized past and the reality of the world outside your window and encourages students to explore this theme through both 2-D and 3-D depictions. 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mia Gallery ROUGHING IT UP: Tactile+Surface=Texture!	Texture is defined by the feel, appearance, or consistency of a surface or a substance. All artists use texture in one form or another. It can be infused into a 2-D or 3-D artwork or it can be implied through painting techniques. Vincent van Gogh, Marcia Gygli, Anselm Kiefer, Justin Gaffrey, J.M.W. Turner, Terese Agnew and Iranian carpets all have demonstrated texture throughout the artworks. Artists like Jane Perkins and Mickalene Thomas used found objects and rhinestones incorporated into their artwork to create layers of texture. In the painting "Fanny/Fingerpainting", Chuck Close used his fingerprints to create the portrait of his wife's mother and created texture throughout the portrait. Leonardo da Vinci also used his fingers to smooth oil paints for a perfect complexion in the portrait of the teenager Ginevra de'Benci. Both artists implied texture by using their fingerprints. This 2-D exhibition allows students to explore the nature of texture through various processes, techniques and tools.
